Diamond Path Elementary - (\$2,475)

1st Grade iPads & Headphones for Managed Independent Learning

This grant will support the purchase and implementation of nine interactive reading stations through the purchase of iPads and headphones. By using applications on the iPads, individual students can access books at their independent reading level and also provide a record of their book choices. The iPads will help to promote oral and visual language as well as literacy skills.

Greenleaf will implement a MakerSpace for creativity, critical thinking, collaboration and communication by purchasing a Makerbot 3D printer. Falcon Ridge Middle School - (\$1,500)

Makerspace 3D
