Since our founding in 2000, the Eastview Community Foundation (EVCF) has provided \$1,712,369 in scholarships, grants, and “Random Acts of Kindness” funds to graduating seniors, teachers and students in the Eastview community. We have a terrific board of 14 dedicated volunteer members. The foundation is supported by numerous others who volunteer to plan and carry out our fundraising events, read scholarship and grant applications and carry out the work of the foundation. We are so grateful for the generous support of our donors, local businesses, volunteers, and other benefactors.

It goes without saying that this school year was like no other. COVID restrictions meant we were unable to hold our annual Light the Night fundraiser. Instead, we relied on individual donations, employer matching grants and community fundraisers. We are currently discussing options for an in-person fundraiser later this summer and will post information about this event on our website when it is available.

Thank you to all our scholarship donors. Because of your generosity, we will award \$86,000 to 85 graduating seniors.

Thank you to all who donated directly to the foundation or supported our community fundraising events whether by eating at a local restaurant fundraiser or by rounding up at Valley Natural Foods. We raised nearly \$3,800 through community fundraisers this year.

EVCF is a registered 501(c)3 non-profit corporation led by an all volunteer board. All of the funds raised are directed to the students, schools and academic community.

# EVCF Grants

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Since 2005, thanks to the generous financial support of individuals and businesses, the Eastview Community Foundation has provided 129 grants totaling \$256,742 to Eastview area schools. EVCF grants have funded numerous technology resources, access to arts and music resources, and instructional materials for students and teachers. In years past, some of these programs and resources have included: MakerBot 3D printers, Apple pencils, external keyboards, multicultural literature, science tools, conscious discipline training and courage retreats.

Thank you to the teachers, administrators, and staff who submitted proposals. The proposals reflect the commitment of educators to provide the best possible educational experience for the students in our community. We hope that these grants will make a positive and lasting impact in the community and in the lives of our students.

This year we are fortunate to be able to support six programs with \$8,554 in grants.

## 2020-2021 EVCF Grant Recipients

### **Eastview High School**

#### **Hydroponik im deutschen Klassenzimmer (Hydroponics in the German Classroom)**

**Steven Sebald, German Teacher | Bruce Miller, Principal**

This grant will fund the project Hydroponik im deutschen Klassenzimmer. The project would be an extension of the units of study found in German Level 4 College in the Schools (CIS) in which the theme of sustainability is interwoven throughout the course. Interacting with nature and taking care of a hydroponic garden in the classroom will lend itself to conversations and interest surrounding sustainability, the environment, and healthy living at home and around the world. Also, the presence of a hydroponic garden in the classroom will spark interest and questions from other students who are not in the CIS course and could lead to activities that encourage growth in proficiency in German, that is asking questions in German, learning the names of the items we are growing in the garden, etc. The hope is that students would have a curiosity about the garden to continue in the different levels of German to reach the point in which they would be able to create their own hydroponic garden when they are enrolled in the CIS German course. This would be open to all students, they would just need to complete the prerequisite levels of German before reaching the CIS course. The connection of inquiry based learning and STEM principles is also an important one that can be linked to language learning and raising proficiency in a language.

## **Eastview High School**

### **Apple Mac mini**

These funds will support the purchase of an Apple Mac mini computer hub. The computer hub will facilitate the AirDrop printing capability of student artwork at EVHS by allowing students to upload their artwork directly to the printer from their iPad/Mobile Device/Creative Cloud. As more and more of the curriculum is going digital (drawing, painting, photography, portfolios, etc.) students will now be afforded a completely mobile and autonomous platform to create their art, print their art and present their art. This platform will allow students to further recognize their full creative potential.

## **Eastview High School**

### **CPR Training Manikins & AED Trainers**

**Breana Wavrunek, Physical Education/Wellness/Safety Education Teacher | Bruce Miller, Principal**

These funds will support the purchase of high quality CPR training manikins (adult and infant) and AED trainers used in CPR and First Aid class. Manikins that are of high quality allow students to see if the depth of their compressions are correct, the timing of their compressions are correct, and if the breaths go into the lungs appropriately which gives students instant feedback allowing them to learn the skill and demonstrate the skill correctly. Also, high quality manikins do not need to be replaced as often. CPR and First Aid class is an amazing opportunity for students to get CPR/FIRST AID/AED certification that also benefits the community as many of these students are lifeguards, camp supervisors, and babysitters. CPR and First Aid is a life saving skill that is priceless.

## **Highland Elementary**

### **Playground Equipment**

This grant will provide new and updated equipment for recess and playground use to ensure that children have ample access to a variety of new playground toys and equipment during their recess time. Due to COVID-19 and social distancing practices put in place, more equipment is needed so that children are able to stay active and play with their friends while still social distancing. Some of the equipment and toys that would be purchased include: footballs, frisbees, hula hoops, bouncy balls, soccer balls, ball pumps, storage buckets and a wheeled storage cart.

### **Literacy Resources**

These funds will provide physical and digital resources to promote literacy in the 6th grade ELA curriculum. We will use both the magazines and digital resources as supplemental materials to provide reinforcement and enrichment to 6th grade English and reading students, aligning with our State Standards.

The EVCF board is proud to continue to fund the Dream Maker, Eastview Puzzle Piece, and Service Scholarships. The board is also delighted to continue the tradition of contributing to the Alumni Scholarship and the Dr. J. Richard Dewey Educator Scholarship.

# Random Acts of Kindness Grants

Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) Grants are awarded to each of the schools in the Eastview community to help meet critical needs of students. These needs are simply defined as those which, if not met, will interfere with or detract from a student's education and overall wellbeing. Every year EVCF presents each of the schools in the Eastview attendance area with discretionary dollars to use in a manner in which they feel will have the most impact. For the 2020-2021 school year EVCF distributed \$16,000 across 12 schools for a total of \$142,250 since the program began in 2005.

RAK dollars have been used in many impactful ways including:

- purchasing art supplies and math games
- providing meaningful experiences
- purchasing winter clothing
- erasing lunch meal debt for families

## Heartfelt Thank You

This summer three of our committed board members will be retiring from the EVCF board: Bridget Handke, Jessica Sahota and Nita Chai. Bridget has worn a variety of hats during her tenure on the board. Everything from reading scholarship essays to serving as Board Chair and most recently Finance Chair, Bridget has dedicated countless hours to the Eastview Community Foundation and the students and teachers that the foundation supports. Jessica is a District 196 alumna who has been a board member since 2017. She has been an integral member of the scholarship committee, acting as the scholarship donor liaison and most recently serving as Scholarship Co-Chair. Nita is an EVHS alumna who joined the board in 2019. She has spent her tenure involved with the scholarship committee and supporting students who come from backgrounds traditionally underrepresented in post-secondary education.

## EVCF “Fund for the Future” Endowment Fund

Early in EVCF’s history, several board members made the decision to establish an endowment fund that once fully funded could support the scholarships and grants given by the foundation as well as cover the operating expenses of the foundation. This would allow the foundation to use 100% of funds raised for students and schools. The initial funds came from the Dream Makers Ball fundraisers and have now grown to over \$135,000 through the financial advising provided by former EVCF board member Bob Kincade of Stonebridge Capital Advisers.
